

## Personal Ministry Debrief – What Do You SEE?

Hebrews 5:14 says, “But solid food is for the mature, who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil.” The underlying assumption in this verse is that through practice in partnership with the presence of God we can train our senses to discern. As we are partnering with others for their breakthrough, it is important to be aware of what is changing in us.

In Ephesians 1:18, Paul is writing to his friends in Ephesus who are in full on revival and the kingdom of God is exploding in their region, “having the eyes of your hearts enlightened, that you may know what is the hope to which he has called you, what are the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints.” Paul’s prayer for his friends who are doing ministry everywhere every day is that the eyes of their hearts would SEE and understand their identity and that they would realize that riches of God’s glorious inheritance is in us.

Below is a quick and easy model to help you pay attention to what is happening personally, the changes that are occurring within yourself, and training your senses to be aware of what the eyes of your heart SEE:

S – What did you **Sense** or pick up on in the spiritual atmosphere? What was the spiritual atmosphere like before and after you and Holy Spirit were there?

E – What did you **Experience** throughout the ministry time? What impacted you? What did you encounter that you anticipated and what surprised you?

E – What did you **Exchange**? What did thoughts or beliefs did you permanently leave behind to partner with the truth Holy Spirit was showing you? What changed in you?

Record your revelations in a journal or an ongoing word document so that you can develop an account of your history with God. Additionally, there will be a connection between your prophetic words and the personal revelation you are experiencing through ministry. It is a good practice to keep track of both and review them together. You will be encouraged!

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
